It's a good bet that you've seen a dinosaur in a museum before. And you'll see one at Bergstrom-Mahler Museum of Glass, too, but it won't be your average beast.

This museum isn't your average museum either. You'd have to travel to the Coasts to see this much beautiful glass in one place. The museum is nestled on the western shore of Lake Winnebago, adding to the spectacular views inside and out.

Use this guide to help you make plans to spend the day in Neenah.

What You Can See

Paperweights

Bergstrom-Mahler Museum of Glass holds the largest, most representative collection of glass paperweights in the world. See paperweights from 19th century French makers to contemporary masters.

Germanic Glass

This collection represents three centuries of glassmaking from northern Europe. Objects date from 1573 through the end of the 19th century.

Contemporary Glass Sculpture

See work by Studio Glass Movement Harvey Littleton and Dominic Labino as well as contemporary artists such as Lino Tagliapietra, Dale Chihuly, Marvin Lipofsky, Josh Simpson, and Paul Stankard.

Art Glass

The Art Glass Collection objects typify the Victorian penchant for decoration. They also demonstrate the competitive atmosphere of the glass factories during the late Victorian period.

Temporary Exhibitions

The museum hosts two temporary exhibitions each calendar year. Glass is always the featured medium. Please check our website for the current schedule.

Where is the museum located?

The museum is off I-41, near exit 132 just 90 minutes north of Milwaukee, and 30 minutes south of Green Bay. The street address is [165 N. Park Avenue, Neenah, WI 54956](#).

Where can I park?

On-street, free parking is available in front of the museum.

What is the price of admission?

General admission is free for everyone, always. Donations are appreciated.

What are the hours?

Tuesday – Saturday 10am – 4:30pm. Sunday 1 – 4:30pm, Closed Monday

Can I make something at the museum?

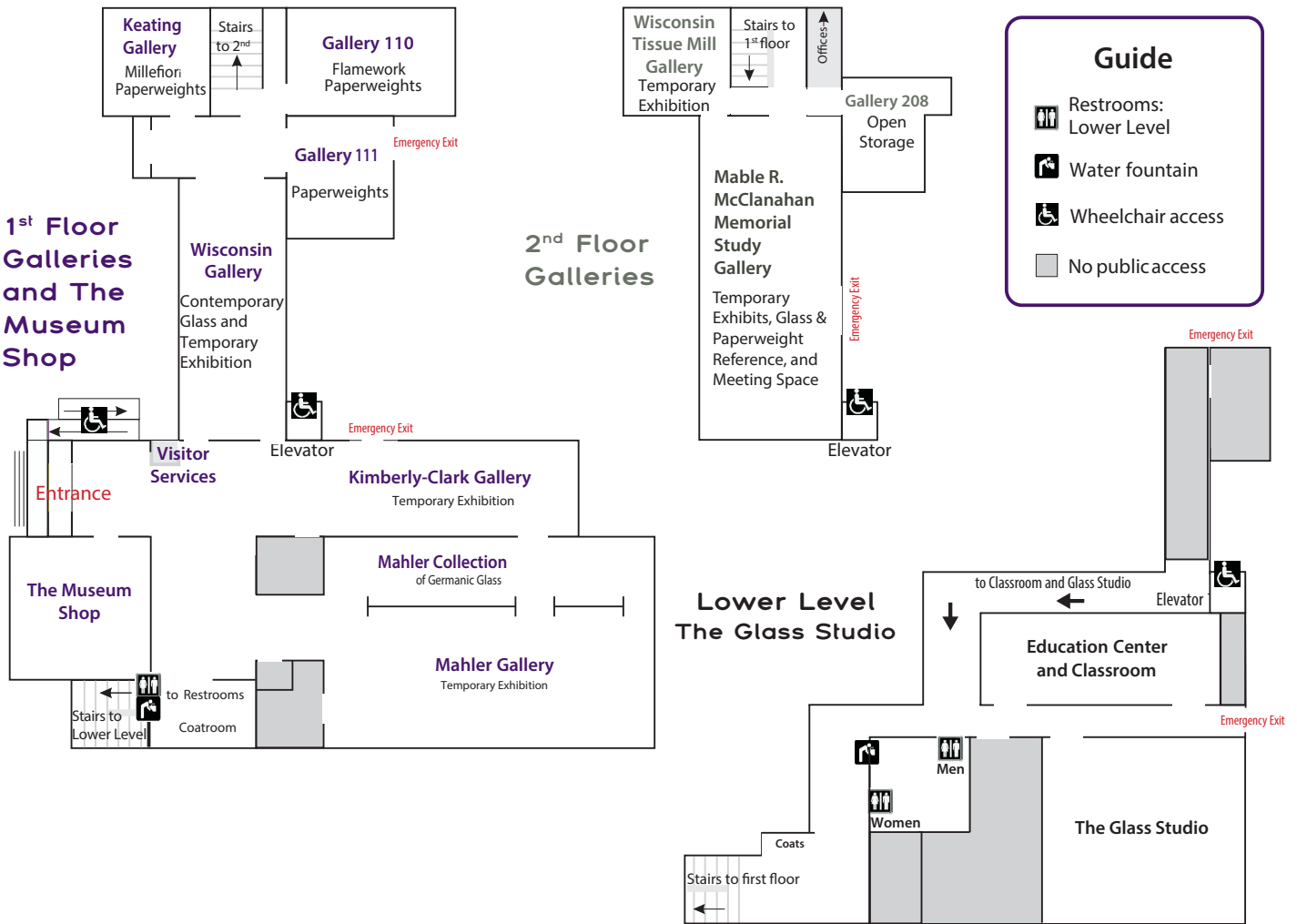
The Glass Studio offers classes in flameworking and fusing. See our schedule of classes for details.
