


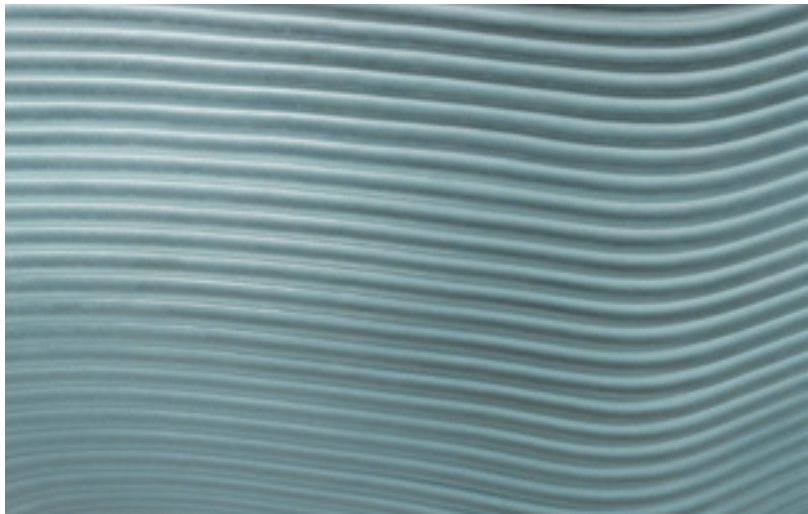
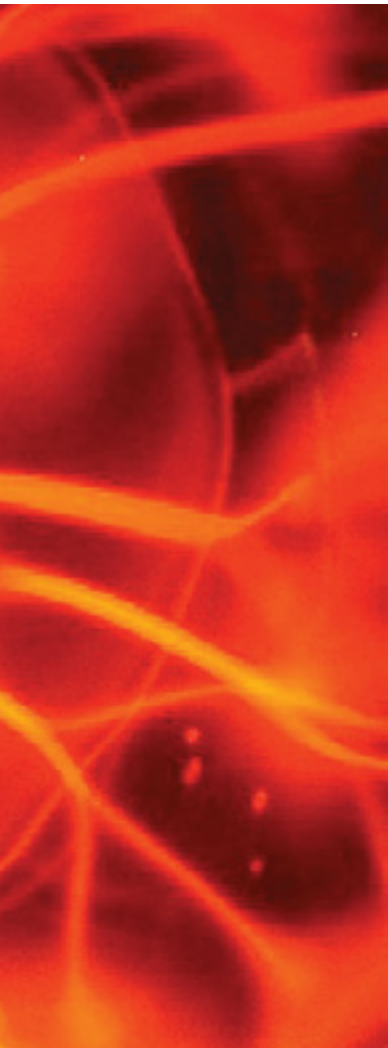

This annual report offers a time for reflection and anticipation. Leading change is a delicate balance between honoring tradition and staying relevant. It is not easy. Bergstrom-Mahler Museum of Glass (BMMOG) is driven by passion with a commitment to serve our visitors and members by providing access to knowledge, dynamic objects, and an excellent experience.

This year, the BMMOG team was challenged to be more responsive to trends and visitor engagement to build new audiences. The results were outstanding: a series of excellent exhibitions such as *Bending Brilliance: Neon and Plasma Sculpture*, that increased audiences, an exceptional studio experience for high school students resulting in over 300 works on view for the *Fox Valley Area High School Glass Exhibition*; and then, we took a *Quantum* leap with an extrasensory installation by Jon Clark, Angus Powers and Jesse Daniels.

The permanent collection expanded through significant gifts. Digital access to the collection on Google Arts and Culture expanded to 1,000 objects. The Museum Shop also followed the on-line trend, successfully providing greater reach. Educational outreach offered experiences for learning and social engagement, Art After Dark lit up the galleries at night with imaginative events that appealed to Millennials.

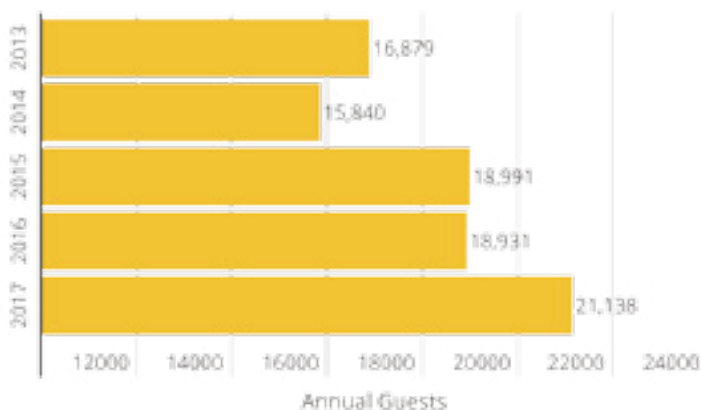
Quantum: an Exhibition of Glass, Light and Sound

April 23 – August 20, 2017

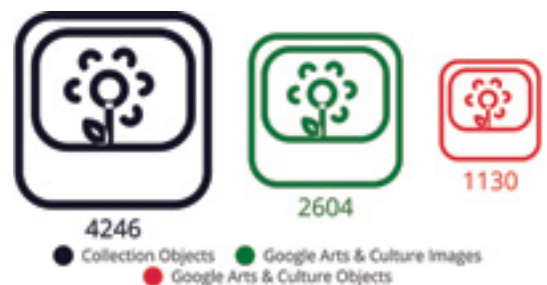

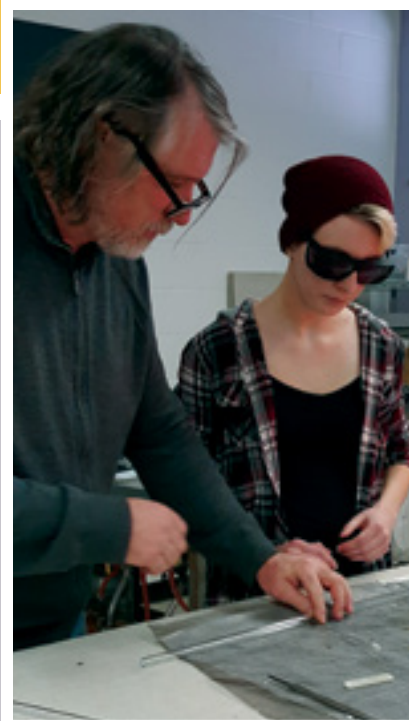
Fox Valley Area High School Glass Exhibition

242 students from 16 schools learn glass, exhibit work

For the past 17 years, an exhibit during the month of March has been dedicated to showing work from area high school students. The 2017 exhibit included glass objects from Appleton West, Berlin, Chilton, Freedom, Menasha, Neenah, New London, Omro, Oshkosh North, Oshkosh West, Renaissance, St. Mary Catholic, Seymour, Stockbridge, Valders, and Xavier high schools.

Students worked with glass artists Sara Rezin, Beth Wenger Johnstone, Jed Schleisner and Tom Galbraith learning glass fusing, flameworking, and neon tube-making techniques in the studio.

Throughout the year, staff welcomed families affected by domestic violence who are sheltering at Christine Ann for supper, a story and a family art-making activity. The goal of the evening was to let kids be kids and build positive family experiences.

Women from Harbor House and Christine Ann Domestic Abuse Services spent a Saturday afternoon creating a glass representation of the home they want to build. Counselors worked with the women to identify images and words that empowered them. Staff created screens and the women screened the images onto glass sheets in the shape of a house. The sheets were layered to form the home and kiln fused.

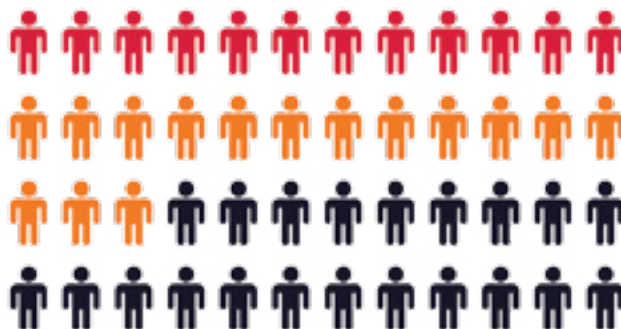
Fortified by Fire

Glass Studio Participation Growth

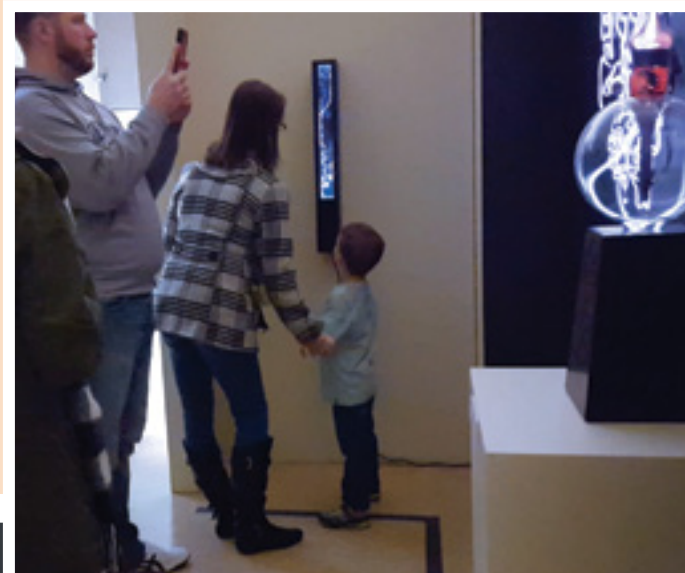

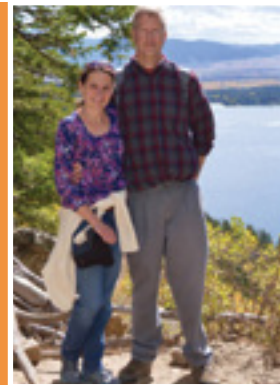

The Collector Marx

Bonnie Marx began her relationship with Bergstrom-Mahler Museum of Glass because of a desire to share her passion with others.

Her upbringing in Yorkville, a rural Illinois community, shaped her passion to explore a variety of educational and business experiences. Since 1975, she has had an interest in collecting regional art, an interest she shared with her late husband, Sidney J. Marx. They were collecting a variety of art mediums until they discovered glass in the 1980s. Marx's passion led to opening Marx Gallery of Chicago in 1990, featuring contemporary studio glass.

She was introduced to the museum in 1990 when glass collectors, Don and Carol Wiiken of Oak Park, IL, recommended Bonnie visit. Shortly thereafter then-curator, Jan Smith, visited Bonnie's Chicago glass gallery.

"I recognized on my first visit to Bergstrom-Mahler Museum, the extraordinary quality of the museum's glass collections and exhibits. This institution continues to be unparalleled in the Midwest. As a glass collector, I wanted to be affiliated with a local museum that always offers thoughtful glass exhibits and carefully conserves the aesthetics and the history of glass art," Bonnie gives as a reason for her support.

Concerning the recent growth of the museum, she has noticed a substantial increase of interest and support for the museum, especially from Midwest collectors of contemporary studio glass art and glass collectors coast to coast. She feels the recognition from artists, critics and other museums will lead to future museum expansion.

"This museum consistently provides not only an extraordinary venue and staff that mounts important exhibits but also careful conservation of their collections. Leaving an art legacy is a rewarding and exciting experience," Bonnie concluded.

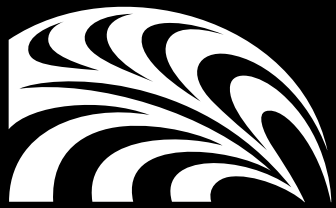
A Sculptor, a Financial Wiz, and Anything But a Bane
