

As editor of *Glass Art* magazine from 1987 to March 2019, Shawn Waggoner has interviewed and written about multitudes of the world's greatest artists working glass in the furnace, at the torch, and on the table. In 2016, Waggoner turned her passion for glass art into a "Terry Gross" style podcast featuring interviews with the likes of Lino Tagliapietra, Narcissus Quagliata, Dante Marioni, Robert Mickelsen, Toots Zynsky, Shayna Lieb, Kelly O'Dell, Raven Skyriver, Ginny Ruffner, Lucio Bubacco, Banjo, Richard Marquis, Judith Schaechter, and many more.

Rated in iTunes New and Noteworthy in 2018, Waggoner's Talking Out Your Glass has grown to 187K followers on Instagram and is downloaded 21K times monthly. The show continues to evolve and now includes discussion of current topics such as how to work glass using sustainable practices, and how artists

2 SUSAN MELGAARD

Wall hangings, bowls, platters; pieces to hang in a window/door made with fusible glass.

3. DEBBIE RADES

Handbags, tapestries, bracelets, boxes made by bead looming and bead embroidery.

4. BENJAMIN JOHNSON

Solid and blown work connect by using pickup ovens, hot bits, and color mixes.

5. THOMAS NYE

Objects from molten glass using Italian and Swedish techniques.

6. PAPERWEIGHT COLLECTORS ASSOC.

Furthering the art and appreciation of glass paperweights.

7. JUSTIN STRAUB

Sculpted and blown lamp-worked borosilicate glass.

8. JACKSON OCHELTREE

Glass orbs form dramatic optical illusions to create a space for the mind to wander.

9. ED MARTIN

Framed, layered mosaics made with pieces of dichroic glass.

10. SEAN MCCLENAHAN

Glass with latticino technique using swirl cane.

11. KATHERINE CHEETHAM

Layered fused, slumped and raked glass with flameworked and recycled copper.

12. GEORGE MACHERT

Hand blown glass with decorations of hot applied glass.

13. J. DAVID NORTON

Multiple layers of clear sheet glass, frit, and torch-formed strings.

14. JANET TOONEN

Fused glass with glassline ink drawings.

15. REBECCA WEBER

Larger, statement pieces made with glass powders, fragments and sheets.

16. JULIE RHODES

Layered coe 96 glass, with frit, enamel paint, & metals, kiln fired.

17. DEBBIE STEINER

Cut, layered, fused glass art, jewelry, and more, kiln fired.

18. JAMES MERLE

Lost wax casting in glass from found objects with fused glass background, kiln worked.

19. DONNA FEARING

Geometric, abstract, and playful fused glass.

20. EMILY BURM

Handcut sheet glass, frit, powder, and stringer, slumped post full-fuse.

21. KATHY HENSEL

Meaningful pieces made with carefully chosen glass, kiln fired.

22. JIM BRAUN

Kiln formed and cold worked by hand and machine for form and function.

23.JEN SMITH

Frit with stencils and powders full fused on a base glass.

24. AMY SIMPSON

Serving pieces, panels and sculpture created by fusing compatible glass in a kiln.

25. KAREN CROWN

Lampworked beads and small sculptures incorporating upcycled and found objects.

26. KAREN KRUEGER

Enamel paint on clear or colored glassware, mirrors, vases, and windows.

27. JONI MARHULA

Painted canvas backgrounds with recycled glass blower scraps, jeweler glass scraps etc.

28. CONNOR O'BRIEN

Caning and murrine techniques add color and depth to pieces with intricate designs.

29. SEAN FELIX

Reverse paint, etch & gild with 23k gold leaf on glass using old world techniques.

30. CECILE DEREL

Engraved glass using a handheld rotary tool with various sizes of diamond and stone burs.

31. MAYA TUFF

Pieces that explore abstraction to release anxiety in a beneficial and controlled way.

32. MONICA HARRIS

Glass pieces cut, ground, wrapped in copperfoil, assembled, fluxed, soldered and framed.

33. ROBIN KITTLESON

Functional kiln formed glass made from murrine, reinterpreted in a modern context.

34. SARA REZIN

Glass sculptures, jewelry, and wall art created in colorful glass and enamels, kiln fired.

35. KAETHE PAYNTER

Naturalistic images using a combination of leaded glass and kiln fired glass techniques.

36. MARY ILA DUNTEMANN

Glass beads inspired by the colors and textures of the natural landscape.

37. HOT SHOT OVEN & KILN

38. ART DEPESA

Stained glass, kiln formed glass with cold working by hand and/or machine.

39. DOUG BECKER

Blown glass vessels with multicolored trails and distorted forms with etched surfaces.

Tiffany method of construction, and incorporating non-traditional elements.

41. AMY JASPERSON

Tiffany copper foil method of stained glass construction, and integrating found objects.

42. ALLIE FRITSCH

Unique stained glass pieces made with transparencies, textures and vintage glass from Schlitz Glass Lamps of Milwaukee.

43. SHARON FUJIMOTO

Hand blown glass using colored frit, powders and chards with gold and silver leaf and foil.




